What is Palm Oil?

Palm oil is a form of edible vegetable oil obtained from the fruit of the African oil palm tree. It is found in food, cosmetics and bath products.

The Problem

The African oil palm tree only grows in tropical rainforests. These rainforests are home to approximately half the Earth's plants and animals. Instead of using already cleared land, some companies cut down healthy rainforests and use the profits to fund new plantations.

The Solution

Using sustainable palm oil is a responsible choice. Sustainable palm oil comes from plantations that produce palm oil in a way that minimizes the impact on wildlife.
